The Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University Non-Teaching Staff Union and the College distributed food items to hundreds of families in Kurha, Marda, Anjansinghi, Chenushta, Borda, and Kala Gota. Taking note of all these social activities, the college received the Ramchandra Ganorkar Memorial Social Award for 2020–21. Our college received this cash prize of Rs. 11,000 as a charitable organization working continuously in the social sector.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown, various activities carried out online by all the departments were definitely confidence-building for the students.
