1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Shriram Education Society's Arts & Science College, Kurha Tq. Tiwasa Dist. Amravati is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. It is the leading college in the region which provides higher education in the field of Social Science and Humanities. It runs 7 UG Programs and Research Centers in 03 Subjects. The college has recognized Ph. D. research centres in Marathi, Geography, and Political Sci. Semester pattern is introduced in all programs. College, in-tune with the university academic calendar, prepares annual academic calendar and keep adherence with it. Timely completion of the syllabus with a strong support mechanism in the form of ICT, revision, co-curricular activities and internal evaluation is carried out as per the

College calendar. The college introduced UG Programmes in English, Marathi, Geography, History, Political Science, Home Economics and Marathi Literature. The College runs PG Programmes in History and B.Voc. Degree Course, Diploma in Fashion Designing. (Only one batch is completed, now this program (B.Voc, & Diploma) is closed) The college conducted Certificate Courses in Swami Vivekanand, Gramgeeta, and Leadership Development. The faculty members contributed in paper setting, moderation and central evaluation

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process to ensure timely declaration of results of University examinations.

Some staff members also worked on various academic bodies such as Board of Studies of affiliating university. Academic flexibility is provided through elective/ CBCS courses in undergraduate programs. The college strives for the overall development of the students as the relevant cross cutting issues such as human values; professional ethics, gender sensitization and environment sustainability have been integrated in the curriculum. Stakeholder's feedback system is effectively implemented. Feedback taken from all the stakeholders helps to revise the functioning of the college keeping in view the vision and mission of the college. Most of the programs provide experiential and participative learning through projects, industrial visits, survey, educational tours, and continuous evaluation through seminars, workshops, group discussions, college tests and practical.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The admission process is transparent and follows eligibility criteria of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The reservation policy of the government of Maharashtra is implemented. In assessment period, average percentage of enrolled students is 55 %. Average percentage of seats filled against seats reserved for various categories of students is 38.09%. Student–full time teacher was 32.8

The experiential, participative and problem-solving learning is promoted through laboratory courses, hands-on training, field projects, surveys, and visits to industry and research centers. The college has 10 permanent faculty members, out of them, 09 are Ph.D. and 06 full time teachers are supervisors in three Ph.D. Research Center. Percentage of full time teachers with NET/SET/SLET/ Ph. D. / D.M. / M.Ch. / D.N.B Superspeciality / D.Sc. / D.Litt. during the last five years is 78%. Mechanism of internal/external assessment of the college is based on the regulations and guidelines of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. Programme and course outcomes of all programmes are discussed with in the beginning of academic session. Evaluation of the students' academic performance is carried out through college internal assessment examination and university theory and practical examinations. Average pass percentage of students is 67.76% in the assessment period.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Research, Innovations and Extension

The college has a policy to promote research activities in various departments by providing independent library, internet facilities and necessary instrumentation. Research activities in the college are maintained and monitored by the Principal, IQAC and Research Advisory Committee (RAC) of the college. The College has taken initiatives for creating an ecosystem for innovations by establishing Research Promotion Cell,

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strengthening Information and Communication technology infrastructure and making Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for experiential learning and innovation. The college organizes workshops/ guest lectures on Research Methodology and Intellectual Property Rights Awareness programs.

The college has "Ph.D. Research Centres" in three subjects namely, Marathi, Geography and Political Science, which play an important role in creation and transfer of knowledge. 06 teachers are registered as Ph. D. supervisors in the Research Centre for various subjects. 26 research scholars are registered for Ph.D. in the college research Center and 4 students awarded Ph. D. Our faculty members regularly apply for Minor and Major Research projects to UGC. The College has strengthened the research facilities in Knowledge Resource Centre by accessing N-LIST consortia of INFLIBNET and National Digital Library of India. The college has 91.08 MBPS Connection for Internet facilities.

The publications of teachers in UGC/Scopus listed, peer-reviewed journals are 53, Conference paper 10 and 01 books and 09 chapters in edited volumes/books published and papers published in national/ international conference proceedings by teachers during last five year. 01 Functional MoUs and activities are under collaborations. The college organized National and State level Webinars in various subjects on Research Methodology, IPR and in the subjects offered by the college. They widened the scope for research and extension activities. The college has done remarkable extension activities through various departments and support services such as NSS. The extension activities including health awareness, environmental awareness, and various social issues are carried out in the neighborhood to inculcate awareness and responsibilities among the students regarding the common social issues.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching and learning. The college has an area of 2.25 hector located in the village Kurha with a total built up area of 1368.69 sq.mt, with G+1 floor with adequate parking facility. The institution has well equipped classrooms with 5 LCD projectors, 2 laboratories,1 computer labs, central and research center libraries for the effective teaching learning process. There are 43 computer systems with round a clock Wi- Fi facility with 70 Mbps bandwidth. The college has 03 well equipped classrooms. The Departments of Gography and Home Economics have well equipped Lab. The Library has a Reading Room, Circulation Section, Stack Room, Internet Section, and Periodical Section separately. The college provided academic and infrastructural facilities to the students' i.e. a rich library, well equipped laboratories, internet, computers and other ICT tools to facilitate teaching-learning process. The N-LIST consortia of INFLIBNET National Digital Library of India are used by teachers, students and research scholars for e-resources.

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Student Support and Progression

The college is committed to provide quality education to the students for their overall development and to facilitate their transformation into responsible citizens and competent professionals. 68.45% student's avail scholarships from the state government.

The college encourages and develops entrepreneurial skills among the students through capacity building and skill development programs. In the last five years, 7.17 % students got benefitted by guidance for competitive examinations and career counseling offered by the Institution during the last five years. Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell and Anti-Ragging Committees have been working efficiently in the college. The students are made aware of discipline, rules, regulations, especially antiragging rules through the Induction Programmes conducted in the beginning of the session every year. Campus monitoring is done under CCTV surveillance. In addition, complaints and suggestions boxes are installed in the college campus. No significant grievances were reported in the last five years. During the last five years, 13.7 % outgoing students progress in to higher education and got placed. The college has a rich tradition of outstanding performance in sports/ cultural activities at University / state/ national level. During the last five years 37students are color coat holder in Sports.

NSS students participate Special Camp and University Camp. Every year, students actively participate in Youth Festival, Annual Social Gathering, various cultural competitions and examinations. The college is proud to have a registered Alumni Association comprising number of students from various fields. The alumni of the college support academic, cultural and extension activities of the college and contribute to the overall development of the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The Governance and leadership of the College is in accordance with the vision and mission of the college. The governance of the college is done in a participative and decentralized, democratic way. The College Development Committee is formed with all stakeholders of the Institute for participative, decentralized, and democratic participation in the College Development. CDC prepares an overall comprehensive development plan of the college regarding academic, administrative, and infrastructural growth. The Staff Council of the college is formed for participative and decentralized work of academic activities of the college which is managed through various college committees. The college follows the rules and regulations of Sant Gadge

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Baba Amravati University, Maharashtra Government and University Grants Commission for all kinds of policies, procedures, service rules and recruitment. The IQAC of the college prepared the Perspective plan of Academic and Infrastructure development for five years i.e 2018-2023. Perspective plan included the Academic Plan, Administrative planning, Research and Extension Initiatives, Infrastructural Development, Students Supports and Progression, Quality initiatives and initiatives for environmental consciousness. The college has various welfare schemes for the teaching and non-teaching staff as per the rules and regulations of the government of Maharashtra. In the last five years, 10 % of teachers completed online / face-to-face Faculty Development Programmes. The performance appraisals of the teaching staff are collected at the end of every academic year through the format provided by the parent university. The internal and external audits are conducted regularly. The College receives the salary grant from the Maharashtra State Government and the development grants/funds from the UGC. The utilization of the sanctioned budget is monitored by the Council of Heads, IQAC and CDC. The IQAC has been contributing significantly in many ways for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. The IQAC conducts the academic audit of all the departments, prepares AQAR and participate in NIRF. The IQAC organizes awareness programs/workshops on the NAAC methodology for teachers. The IQAC regularly conducted meeting and sublimed Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to NAAC. The College has ISO 9001: 2015 Quality Management System certifications. Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary: Shriram Education Society, Dhamangaon Railway intends to start Arts and Science College, Kurha in rural area to impart the higher education to the students with all adequate facilities. The college is a single faculty college but the college has planned to transform the college into interdisciplinary institution. The college has submitted proposal to the affiliating university for M.A. (Marathi, Geography, Political Science) to start P.G. program and also submitted proposal for B.Com.and B.Sc. faculty. The affiliating university introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the session 2022-23. On the basis of stipulated norms and guidelines regarding NEP implementation

	the college has taken steps to facilitate the all round development of the students with enhancement in employability and skills for new jobs in various fields. The college has introduced skill based certificate courses for the students. In future the college has planned to equipped the students with essential skills to earn their wages.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	As per NEP guidelines regarding ABC it is introduced and academic credit is a unit by which the course work is measured. Each course may be allotted credits in proportion to the time expected to be devoted by the students by that course. The college is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University which adopted NEP from the session 2022-23. As per university instructions the college has registered all first year students for their Academic Bank of Credits on Digilocker. Students can now avail to recognize, accumulate, transfer the credits the benefits of multiple entry and multiple exit during the chosen programs. The students are encouraged for enrolling online courses from SWAYAM/NPTEL where the students may earn credits from renowned HEIs.
3. Skill development:	The College Development Committee and IQAC in its meetings resolved to start skill development courses in order to accumulate essential skills in students for developing them for their employability. The college started certificate programs from the session 2018-19. The college runs skill based Degree course in Fashion Design and Management and Diploma course in Fashion Designing & Apparel Production from the session 2018-19.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The teaching at UG level is in bilingual i.e in Marathi and English. Students have choice to write in his/her vernacular language. The college has started B.A. UG Program in two languages i.e in English and Marathi. The college library has developed rich collection of books in English, Marathi and Hindi. The college has a program in History which is taught in Marathi which provide a platform to study Indian Arts, Culture and Tradition. The college also provides various platforms to the students to present their linguistic and cultural talents. The college magazine, wall magazines, Essay Competitions, Debate Competitions, and Elocution Competitions organized at various levels, Annual Social Gatherings, and

	Participation in Youth Festival organized by the University provide a regular platform to promote Indian languages, Art and Culture.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	The college has developed Program Outcome, Program Specific Outcome and Course Outcome of all the programs offered by the college. The college is an affiliated college which follows the curriculum based on outcome prescribed by the University as per National Education Policy. The college measures the level of outcome of the program and courses through direct and indirect methods. The college developed the level of attainment for measuring the outcome of learning.
6. Distance education/online education:	NEP emphasized distance education / online education which expand the access to education and training for employed students. Since its flexible schedule reduce the effects of the time constraints imposed by personal responsibilities and commitment. The Institute has already started working on these aspects. The ICT based facilities are created for imparting online education. Teachers are encouraged to create online add-on and skill based courses. Teachers are suggested to develop econtent and online teaching material. To cope up with the advanced teaching skills and to understand current online teaching trends, teachers are motivated to participate in advanced pedagogy training programs. The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

Our College is currently having the following mechanisms for effective delivery of curriculum. At the beginning of an academic session, Staff meeting held under the Chairmanship of Principal in which yearly plan of various program and teaching has been discussed. Academic Calendar has been prepared through the constituted committee and all programs and teaching schedule according to the Academic Calendar. Teachers prepare their lectures according to the syllabus allotted and classes available. The time-table committee of the institution designed the time table for UG, PG. Time table prepared by timetable committee was displayed on the notice board, copy of time table was sent to each department after endorsement by the Principal. Teachers conducted the seminars, assignments, unit tests, group discussions, power point presentations, industrial/ study tours and projects for the students. This helps to monitor if the teaching plans have been successfully implemented, and this is further verified and substantiated through student's feedback on teachers. Internal examinations are conducted according to university guidelines. Day wise record of the day's work is maintained in daily diaries by all faculties. Records of co-curricular activities with signatures of the participants were maintained in all departments. Records of tests, assignments and internal assessments were maintained in departmental files in hard copies. Advanced learners have scope to experiment and go beyond the course while doing regular work and thereby to improve their presentation skill. For the meritorious students extra coaching, project works are given to help their representation in intercollegiate competitions. Toppers are encouraged with cash prize, memontos in the annual social gathering.

An induction programme from the session 2021-22, 2022-23 is conducted in the beginning of the session for the newly admitted students. Through a well-planned time table, planner, workload, scheme of evaluation and calendar, an effective curriculum is delivered and documented. Guest lectures by eminent personalities in the relevant area, workshops and industrial visits are organized for imparting quality education. The staff council meetings are conducted to plan the proposed activities such as guest lectures, seminars, workshops, conferences, educational tours and other academic activities as per the syllabus. The faculty members are allocated classes/ subjects in the beginning of the session. Timely completion of the syllabus, revision, co-curricular activities and internal evaluation is carried out as per the academic calendar. The internal assessment of UG Students are carried out as per the curriculum of concerned subject of University. The internal assessment of the students is carried out through assignment work, unit test, group discussion, seminars and practical work. The criterion for internal assessment is displayed on the notice boards. Information regarding departmental activities, internal assessments, University examinations is displayed on the Notice Board and whatsApp groups. The faculty of the college ensures that marks for the internal assessment are uploaded timely on the University portal. All faculty members contribute in paper setting, moderation and central evaluation process to ensure timely declaration of results of University examinations.

Being an affiliated college the institution functions within the curricular parameters set by SGBAU, Amravati. Various topics, chapters, poems and practical in the curricula prescribed by Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati do dwell upon cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics. As prescribed by syllabus of parent university curricula of various subjects cover topics like ecology and environment that bring out relationships among organisms on earth as well as the mutual influence of organisms and their environment.

Environmental Studies has been included as a compulsory subject for second year UG students across streams. The prescribed syllabus of this subject touches upon cross-cutting issues like climate change, renewable and non-renewable sources of energy, population explosion and gender equity etc. Courses in humanities teach students about ethics and professional values, human values such as teaching of saints and political leaders which make students aware about human values and professional ethics. Topics like Gender bias and Human rights, Right to equality and non-discrimination, entrepreneurship, population growth, family welfare, human rights, women and child welfare values and gender sensitization are discussed in these courses. The theoretical information imparted during classroom teaching through carefully planned activities by various committees. To raise awareness among students, various teaching departments have conducted Poster and Essay Competitions, elocution, debate, Rangoli, Model Presentation, Wall-paper, Seminar Presentation Competition on events etc. Plantation drives and cleanliness drives are regularly arranged.

On an average, the numbers of girl students are admitted more in the college than the number of male students. "Women' Cell' and 'Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee' is dedicated for welfare of women, which works effectively to look into the issues of girls and female staff, if any. Health awareness programmes, awareness programs on Hemoglobin Check up and providing nutrious diet for

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girl students, and organized cancer check-up camp, health related issues Camp for women organized by NSS need for physical fitness etc. are carried out every year in college. 2.3.1

Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences and teachers use ICT- enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning process

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Response:

The Departments of college employed the following methods to enhance learning effectively.

Experiential learning: Experiential learning is an engaged learning process whereby students "learn by doing" and by reflecting on the experience. Experiential learning activities can include, but are not limited to, hands-on laboratory experiments, internships, field exercises, academic, and research and stage performances. Well-planned, supervised and assessed experiential learning programs can stimulate academic inquiry by promoting interdisciplinary learning, civic engagement, career development, cultural awareness, leadership, and other professional and intellectual skills. In Experiential learning students learn to take initiative, make decisions, and be accountable for the results. Students engage intellectually, creatively, emotionally, socially, or physically. The college focuses on experiential teaching and learning techniques. In the academic session 2020–21, various programmes such as workshops, seminars, essay competitions, elocution, quiz competitions, and various days of celebration were conducted through online platforms due to the pandemic. To raise community awareness and sensitivity among students, as well as to learn experientially, they participated in various extension activities such as Dipawali Snehmilan, Blanket Distribution, Visits to Old Age Homes, and so on, while adhering to the COVID-19 rules and guidelines.

Participative learning: Participative learning approach is a form of a reflective learning approach which is learner centred teaching method. This method stresses the subjectivity of learners and the self construction of knowledge. Different departments arrange programs for learners to participate in different activities and learn on their own. Workshops, E- classroom sessions, seminars, study tours are the some activities college organize throughout the academic year to nurture the students' participants. Seminar is another approach to learn the things by participation. his is also an effective learning method for students. In the academic year 2020–21, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the students participated almost exclusively through online mode in various competitions organised by various departments of the college and other colleges also. Students participated in online tests, seminars, exams for university, group discussions, etc.

A Problem-Solving Method: This method promotes critical thinking, creativity, and scientific temperament. The students are expected to observe, understand, analyze, and find solutions that lead to a holistic understanding of the concept. All the teachers counsel the students to solve their problems, though it may be personal, whenever they needed.

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The college has performed an internal evaluation process as per the norms and guidelines of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The examination committee prepared the internal theory and practical examination time tables as per the university examination circular. Mechanism of internal/external assessment of the college is based on the regulations and guidelines of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The schedule of internal assessment is prepared and conveyed to the staff and students by posting it on the notice board and whatsapp groups. The syllabus for internal assessment is given to the students well in advance. The students' internal assessment is done by the subject teachers as per the university guidelines. The remark on the evaluated assignment books/project reports/ practical books help students in analyzing their mistakes and improve upon their performances. There is a mechanism for addressing grievances in internal assessment at the college level. The students convey their grievances to the concerned teachers who after due verifications convey the grievances to

the affiliated University through the office. The departments conduct reexaminations for the students who are involved in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities or sports events during the internal assessment schedules.

External assessment is done through the examinations conducted by Sant Gadgebaba Amravati University Amravati. The procedures of the conduct of University Examination are given in Ordinances No. 6 & 9 of Amravati University. Though the college has no role in framing the schedule and procedure of the University examinations, all infrastructural facilities as well as the services of the college staff are provided for the examination. The college has been providing all these facilities to the University for the conduct of both Summer and Winter Examinations.

As per Ordinance No. 19 of 2001, there is a Central Assessment Programme Scheme of Evaluation and Moderation of answer books and preparation of results of the examinations, conducted by the University. The Board of Studies recommend the names of suitable persons for inclusion in the panels for appointments by the Board of Examinations as examiners and Moderators for evaluation and moderation of answer books of the University examinations. The teachers regularly participate in the Central Assessment Program of the University. In case of grievances, the examinees are permitted to apply for reassessment of answer books after obtaining Photocopies of answer books as per Ordinance No. 16 of 2007 and also the examinees are permitted to apply for reassessment of answer books of examinees without obtaining Photocopy of answer books as per Direction No. 66 of 2010 (main Direction) read with Direction No. 11 of 2015, Direction No. 24 of 2015 and Direction No. 22 of 2016. The examinee can apply only by making online application on the University Website and take out hard copy of the same. The hard copy of application form is to be submitted in the Confidential Section of the Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University within 15 days from the date of publication of declaration of general result of that examination.

All the subject teachers prepared Semester-Wise evaluation Reports. Internal examination committee analyzed evaluation reports of results. Institute considered Feedback from the Stakeholders for the attainment of PO, PSO and CO. The college is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati and follows the curriculum prescribed by the university from time to time. The curriculum of each subject has been designed to be outcomes-based. The college has "Research Centers" in three subjects namely Marathi, Geogrphy and Political Sci. which play an important role in creation and transfer of knowledge. 06 teachers are registered as Ph. D supervisors in the Research Centre for various subjects. 26 research scholars are registered for Ph.D. in the college. Our faculty members regularly apply for Minor and Major Research projects to UGC.

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Some of the strategies of providing ecosystem for innovation are:

- The faculty are empowered to take up research activities by utilizing the existing facilities provided by college like research journals, equipments, computer lab, internet and library.
- The college has created a learning environment for students with practical- oriented pedagogies. Expert interaction with the guest lectures and talk on special issues are also conducted with reputed academicians as resource persons. Industry visits, debates, elocution, essay competitions, model exhibition, rangoli and poster making competition etc. The student also take up the project report /survey in their respective field of study as a part of the curriculum. Field work, assignment, educational tour and visit being the part of curriculum at UG and PG Student. The students are motivated to participate in Avishkar for presenting innovations at University Level.
- Career counseling cell conducts various activities for development of students. Such as awareness
 meets, workshop, seminar and guest lectures on entrepreneurship, financial awareness, IPR in
 which expert from different background share their experiences, ideas and prospective areas of
 innovation with the students to prime them to get involved in innovative work.
- The college has strengthened the research facilities in Knowledge Resource Center by accessing N-LIST consortia of INFLIBNET and National Digital Library of India.
- Printed as well as e-books, free internet access facility.
- College has continuously tried to create an ecosystem for innovations and facilitated creation and transfer of knowledge through various extension activities that have been carried out in the neighborhood community through NSS, SDC, Nature Club, Department of Physical Education and Sports. These carefully planned extension activities have acted as a way of our students.
- The students are also encouraged to publish their articles in the college magazine 'Gramjyoti', wall magazines, journals and newspapers.
- All faculty members published conference papers, research papers in the peer reviewed UGC approved journal
- The college organized various online webinars, workshops in different subjects during Covid-19 pandemic.

Moreover there are 1 common rooms one for girls. The college has a land area of 2.25 Hecter and total built up area is 1368.69 sq.feet, with G+1 floors and adequate parking facility. The institution has well equipped classrooms with 5 LCD projectors,2 laboratories,1 computer labs, central and departmental libraries for the effective teaching learning process. There are 40 computing systems with round a clock Wi- Fi facility with 70 Mbps bandwidth. The institution follows ICT enabled, practical oriented, learner- friendly modes of

instruction to make student centric teaching learning process. To make learning process practical and research oriented, the department and research laboratories are well equipped and timely upgraded .The central library is computerized with NLIST Consortia with remote log-in access to e- resources. The library is enriched with a section of reference books, text books, e- resources, and reading hall withcapacity of 35 students. Additional Infrastructural Facilities: In campus, , rain water harvesting system, a fire extinguisher ,and solar energy generation system with capacity of 05 kV. There is a facility of ramps for the physically challenged students to move by the wheel chair without any difficulty. Available physical infrastructure is optimally utilized beyond regular teaching to carry out projects, certificate courses, co-curricular activities, staff meetings etc. Terraces of all buildings are also utilized for necessary facilities like installation of Solar Panels, Water storage tanks etc. College has Green beautiful campus with ornamental plants and landscapes. the garden have medicinal and economic importance. The flora and fauna in the campus also serve as a means of environment conservation. With the aim of inculcating social responsibility and awareness among the students, many social activities were implemented by various departments of the college. It is the civic duty of every educational institution to involve itself in socially relevant causes thereby facilitating community living. The tremendous energy of our student volunteers is capable to fend off challenges like natural calamities, social evils, superstitions, and deprivations/poverty prevalent in the society. The college through its NSS, Student Development committee carries out activities like blood

donation camps, flood-relief measures, visit to orphanages/old age homes. Kalagota Diwali Sneh Milan Sohla, help to the flood victims in Kerala, help to the people of the fire-hit village of Bhilori in the Melghat area, comforting and honoring the families of the martyrs in the area, etc.

4. The Practice

On behalf of the college, every year Snehamilan Sohla is celebrated on the occasion of Diwali at KalaGota(Pardhibeda). In August 2020, there was a large-scale flood crisis in the state of Kerala, in which many lives were lost and some houses were destroyed. In order to help the

flood victims, the college students collected relief funds and sent it to the Kerala flood victims. In May 2019, a fire broke out in the village of Bhilori, a remote area of Melghat area of Amravati district, in which most of the poor people's houses and household materials and food

grains got burnt. The college took note of this news and visited Bhilori village and distributed food and Pots to the fire victims of this village. Voter awareness program was organized to let students know about their voting right, voting procedure and to enrol their names as voters. During the Corona period, Corona awareness, distribution of masks, pockets of food grains were distributed to the poor. In the summer of 2019, Kurha villages experienced severe water shortage. A workshop was organized on behalfof the college on making Ganesha idols from clay, keeping in mind the fact that Plaster of Paris idols are brought in the market for this festival and the disposal of these idols has many negative effects on the environment. These clay idols were environmentally friendly so there is no pollution many students made clay Ganesha idols and sold them in the market and some students also took these idols home. The college has setup a rain water harvesting unit to improve groundwater level in campus. Well water recharge system is also installed in college to prevent well from going dry during summer. Since there are green trees in the college premises, many birds live on this tree, so that drinking water is available to these birds in summer, a water pots was arranged for the birds by the NSS department of the college. Water pots were also distributed to the people of many villages in the area. Regular plantation drive is also carried out in campus and also nearby locality.
